- **Handling, Housing, and Stockmanship:** Best practice for moving, milking, and managing cattle safely, and how good stockmanship improves welfare and farm outcomes.
- **Nutrition and Water:** Providing cattle with the right feed and clean water to support health, production, and wellbeing.
- **Young Stock and Bobby Calves:** Welfare responsibilities for calves, including care, transport, shelter, and humane treatment from birth.
- **Stress and Behaviour:** Understanding how cattle respond to stress and how good handling, facilities, and routines reduce fear and injury.
- **End-of-Life Care and Euthanasia:** Ethical and legal responsibilities when animals are injured, sick, or need to be humanely put down.

By completing this course, you will be better equipped to care for dairy cattle in a way that is legal, ethical, and practical. You will understand how strong animal welfare supports not just the animals, but also farm reputation, staff safety, and the future of the dairy industry.
